Pathways to licensure: Special Licence

Have a medical degree from a medical school listed in the World Directory of Medical Schools that is acceptable in Canada

Be legally entitled to live and work in New Brunswick

Be proficient in English or French language

Successfully completed training program or have a combination of training and practice experience relevant to the intended discipline of practice

Must be current in clinical practice for at least 450 hours within 3 years preceding candidate application

Provide evidence of good character and fitness to practice

Must have credentials that are acceptable to the College of Family Physicians of Canada (CFPC) or the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC) or le Collège des médecins du Québec (CMQ) (Otherwise have Practice Eligibility Letter from RCPSC or CFPC or CMQ)

Must have at least 1 year of independent practice following certification, as listed previously

•CFPC approved jurisdictions include:

Australia, Ireland, United Kingdom and United States

•RCPSC approved jurisdictions include:

Australia, New Zealand, Hong Kong, Singapore, South Africa, Switzerland, United Kingdom, and Ireland.

Eligible for Special Licence

Must have successfully completed 2 years of relevant postgraduate training or 2 years of independent practice experience in Canada or United States

The Special Licence must be sponsored by a Regional Health Authority or other similar public authority for purpose of employment
